The School District of Marathon City Board of Education is pleased to announce the selection of three finalists to interview for the position of District Administrator: Adam Jacobson, Matthew Raduechel, and Angela Woyak.

As part of the selection process, the three finalists will spend a "Day in the District" on Monday, April 7, 2025. The day will include a tour of buildings with the school principals; tour of the District with our current District Administrator; meeting time with staff and students; and, our parents, families, and community members will also have an opportunity to meet the candidates that day. All interested families, parents, and community members are invited to participate on Monday, April 7th from 6:00-8:00 p.m. at the Marathon High School Auditorium.

The Board of Education will conduct final interviews with each of the candidates on April 9th and will announce the candidate selected to serve as Superintendent at the April 16, 2025, regular Board meeting, with an anticipated start date of July 1, 2025.
