

FUNCTIONS OF THE SCHOOL BOARD

The Board of Education shall:

1. Establish the necessary policies for the operation of the schools and all related programs. The Board shall adopt policies and practices after consulting with the District Administrator.
2. Select an administrator of the district, who shall be the chief executive officer of the system and who shall be directly responsible to the Board. The District Administrator shall have responsibility for the administration of the district and, in cooperation with the Board, shall revise plans and policies, keep the electorate informed and furnish leadership to the Board and the instructional staff.
3. Examine and evaluate school activities. Information about activities shall be provided by the District Administrator at the request of the Board. The Board shall give counsel and advice to the District Administrator regarding the administration of the schools as it deems necessary.
4. Strive to develop ways and means of serving the community and keeping parents/guardians, patrons and taxpayers informed of the schools' programs and needs.
5. Have as a basic criterion for evaluating any issue that is brought before the Board, the effect upon the educational welfare of the boys and girls in the district. (This duty also applies to the District Administrator.)
6. Determine, upon the advice of the District Administrator, the needs of the district and provide support throughout the budgetary process.
7. Perform the specific duties imposed upon the Board by state law.
