

FOOD SERVICES PROGRAM

Students in the Marathon City School District shall have an opportunity to participate in school lunch and milk programs. These programs shall be administered by the District Administrator, or designee, in accordance with established guidelines.

Food service prices shall be established by the Board annually. The food services program is designed to be self-sustaining and the Board reserves the right to adjust prices as conditions warrant.

In accordance with federal guidelines, the district shall provide free and reduced price food services to children of families whose income levels meet criteria established by the National School Lunch Program and administered by the Department of Public Instruction (DPI). The District Administrator shall have the responsibilities of the local school food service authority and shall receive applications on approved forms. Parents/guardians not in agreement with the District Administrator's disposition of their application may appeal to the Board Clerk.

Vending machines may be installed in district schools only when approved by the Board.

The Marathon City School District shall not discriminate in school-sponsored food service programs on the basis of sex, race, religion, national origin, color, ancestry, creed, pregnancy, marital or parental status, sexual orientation or physical, mental, emotional or learning disability or handicap. Discrimination complaints shall be processed in accordance with established procedures.
