Attendance Matters - And So Do You

Showing up each day is one of the simplest yet most powerful ways students can set themselves up for success. It builds strong learning habits, keeps students connected to their peers and teachers, and ensures they don't miss the important moments that help them grow academically and socially. To ensure compliance with our school board's attendance policies, please review the following procedures for reporting student absences, late arrivals, or early dismissals:

- Notification for Absences: For any absence, parents must provide written or oral notification to the school, including the reason and duration of the absence. The school board may verify these statements or investigate further as needed.
- Excused Absences: Contact the school before 8:30 AM on the day of the absence for it to be considered excused.
- Planned Late Arrivals/Early Dismissals: Notify the school in advance of the date and time for these to be excused.
 Justifiable reasons will be evaluated per board policy.
- Absence Limits: Parents may excuse up to 10 days (or parts of days) per school year. Beyond this, absences (e.g., for appointments) require a professional note (doctor, dentist, etc.) to be excused.
- Athletic Participation: Additional attendance rules apply for students involved in sports. Please refer to the Athletic Code for details.
- Unexcused Absences: These may be referred for truancy when appropriate.
