For those students who took an ECCP/SCN college course during the 2021/2022 school year, here are the course names/numbers for your reference when requesting a college transcript. Your high school transcript will only list a grade for high school. If you intend to transfer your college course grade to the institution you are attending in the fall, you must request a final transcript from each institution that you attended while in high school. Login to your respective college account to request official transcripts. Please wait until spring grades are finalized in May before requesting college transcripts.

Please Note: Marathon High School does not handle college transcript requests.

Please Note: If you completed high school courses for Dual Credit, you are responsible for requesting college transcripts from the appropriate college.
