# **College Courses in High School**

#### Early College Credit Program

High School students, grades 10-12, may be eligible to take courses during the fall or spring semesters to earn college credits through Early College Credit Program (ECCP). Eligible students may be permitted to enroll at one of the UW campuses to take one or more courses for which the student may earn high school credit, college credit, or both. Please note, transportation is not provided and only those courses not offered by Marathon High School will be considered by the school board after the student has exhausted all possible coursework at Marathon.

To be considered, students in grades 10-12 must have a 2.5 GPA or better in high school. Furthermore, each college sets their own admission standards and may have a higher GPA requirement and/or placement test requirements.

All students must display a level of responsibility and maturity needed to succeed in a college-level course. If approved by the school board, the student can receive both high school and college credit or just college credit upon successful completion of the course. Students may not take remedial courses through ECCP.

Failure to pass a course will result in the student and/or family paying the fee for the course. College courses taken by high school students become part of the permanent University record and may affect subsequent admission to posts-secondary institutions. Please be aware that a poor grade earned in an ECCP course could have a negative impact on a future admissions decisions for a student.

#### Start College Now

Start College Now (SCN) will allow high school students the opportunity to take college courses at WI Technical Colleges. The process is similar to ECCP.

#### <u>Dual Credit</u>

Dual Credit Enrollment aligns high school and postsecondary curriculum to allow high school students to take college level coursework in order to get a head start on earning college credit while continuing to fulfill high school graduation requirements.

Applications for Spring Semester 2024 ECCP, Start College Now, CAPP, and/ or Dual Credit are due to Ms. Aune by Friday, September 30. Meetings will be held during Raider Enrichment to explain the application process to students.

#### Will in-person orders also be accepted?

If you and your student feel more comfortable ordering your yearbook in person instead of online, you can do so starting **Tuesday**, **September 5th**.

#### What are the requirements for Senior Photos and when are they due?

Seniors are asked to submit **two (2)** pictures for their senior portrait pages. This can either be a senior portrait and a baby/childhood photo **OR** two senior portraits. All photos submitted **MUST** follow the **Senior Photo Submission Rules** and need to be **300 dpi** or higher.

The deadline for submitting senior photos is **Friday**, **December 1st.** Photos can be emailed to <u>yearbook@marathonschools.us</u> or dropped off in the high school office. Please make sure the photos are labeled with the student's first and last name.

#### Can I still submit photos from the 2022-2023 school year?

We connect high school students with a college mentor who works **one-on-one** with students throughout the college and financial aid processes.





#### APPLY

You may be eligible if you...

- Are on track to graduate high school in the Class of 2024
- Attend high school in the US (regardless of citizenship status)
- Have a 3.5 Unweighted GPA
- Have an annual family income of less than \$80,000
- Take a rigorous course load OR have a standardized test score in the 90th percentile
  - ACT: 29 or higher | SAT: 1350 or higher | PSAT: 1280 or higher

#### MEET YOUR COLLEGE MENTOR

If accepted, students are matched with a near-peer mentor who works **one-on-one** with their students through the end of the senior year.

Matriculate advisors are trained college students from different schools including Yale, Columbia, University of California-Berkeley, and more!

## **COMPLETE YOUR COLLEGE TASKS**

Once students are matched with a Matriculate mentor, they meet **virtually** - through video and voice calls, text and email - to complete their college tasks like building a college list, completing the college application, and applying for financial aid and scholarships, and more!

Our students typically meet with their Matriculate advisor at least once a month.
