

**EMPLOYEES OCCUPATIONALLY EXPOSED
TO BLOODBORNE PATHOGENS**

The Marathon City School District shall strive to safeguard the health and well-being of district employees and promote a safe work environment. As required by law, a bloodborne pathogens exposure control plan shall be developed and adopted for use in the district. The plan shall be designed to reduce an employee's exposure to the hepatitis B virus (HBV), human immunodeficiency virus (HIV) and other bloodborne pathogens in the workplace.

It is the district's full intention that, if necessary, the physical facility, work practices and other areas shall be modified to attain the plan's goal. In addition, employees shall be informed and trained so that they, too, can contribute to the reduction and elimination of exposure.

A copy of the district's bloodborne pathogens exposure control plan shall be kept in the District Administrator's office and kept current.
