

**STUDENT TRANSPORTATION SERVICES**

The Board of Education of the Marathon City School District shall provide student transportation as follows:

1. Transportation shall be provided to and from school for all resident students who live two or more miles from their school of attendance in the district.
2. Transportation shall be provided to and from school for students attending a public or private school within the district and living in the following area: north of the Rib River bridge at the north end of the village, west of West Street (Pine Street), south of a line determined by extending the south line fence of the cemetery in an east-west direction and east of a line dividing sections five and six in the town of Marathon (from the intersection of NN and 4<sup>th</sup> Street).
3. Transportation shall be provided to and from school for all resident students who live in designated areas of unusual hazard.
4. Transportation shall be provided to and from school for resident students attending private schools as required by state law.
5. Transportation shall be provided to and from school for children with disabilities in accordance with state law.
6. Transportation shall be provided to and from school for students under other circumstances approved by the Board.
7. School vehicles, if available, shall be furnished for all field trips. All travel shall be subject to budget limitations and all transportation shall be dependent upon the prior approval of the District Administrator.
8. Students enrolled in the 4-year-old kindergarten program will be transported in accordance with their attendance schedule.
9. Students will comply with all bus rules and regulations, and with any lawful orders given by the Bus Driver.

The Board may provide for transportation of students to extracurricular activities. The District Administrator must authorize the use of school vehicles for summer trips and trips during the school year.

The Board shall contract for all regular student transportation routes. The length of any contract shall be for not more than three years.

All state and federal laws pertaining to transportation and transportation personnel shall be known by the contractor. Compliance with state and federal law shall be mandatory.

The District Administrator shall be responsible for the student transportation program. The District Administrator shall continually appraise the student transportation program and make recommendations for its improvement in terms of maximum service, safety, economy and efficiency.
