ACADEMIC COLLEGE-READY INDICATORS

A student is considered “college ready” by maintaining a 2.8 GPA and meeting one other additional academic indicator below.

2.8 GPA

High School Grade Point Average is consistently the strongest predictor of 4-year college outcomes for all academic disciplines, campuses and freshman cohorts.

77% (78%) earned 2.8 or higher

ADVANCED PLACEMENT COURSES

Taking and passing AP courses demonstrates college-level achievement and can shorten time to degree completion.

20 (35) AP exams taken

80% (86%) AP exams passed

ACT COMPOSITE SCORE

Another indicator of college success.

UW COLLEGES DUAL CREDIT COURSES COMPLETED

Students in dual credit courses are more likely to persist to a second semester in college and earn a higher college GPA.

CAREER-READY INDICATORS

A student is considered “career ready” by meeting either two indicators below or one indicator below plus two college-ready indicators.

ATTENDANCE RATE FRESHMAN YEAR

Course attendance freshman year is 8 times more predictive of course failure than any 8th grade test.

93.2% (93%) had 90%+ attendance rate
(85.7% WI state average)

TECHNICAL COLLEGE DUAL CREDIT ACCESS

Access to dual credit classes in multiple pathways increases the likelihood of a student finding and starting a career pathway right after high school.

81 (91) students enrolled
399 (297) credits taken through Northcentral Technical College

CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

Extra-curricular activities are one of the best investments a school can make to promote achievement, student engagement, and attitudes and habits leading to college aspirations and ultimate success.

83% (82%) involved in at least 1 organized activity (63.3% WI state average)

65% (64%) involved in 2 or more

YOUTH APPRENTICESHIP / SCHOOL TO CAREER

Participation in industry-themed pathways prepares students for successful transitions to post-secondary education and employment.
