


Post Secondary Options

Financial Aid - FAFSA

- Free Application for Federal Student Aid
- Opens on October 1 of senior year
- Determines your eligibility for grants, loans, work study, and some scholarships
- FREE to apply!

SCHOLARSHIPS

MONEY AWARDED

- Supports students education based on set criteria
- Scholarships are unique and have different set criteria that a student must meet in order to be eligible

- The more scholarships a student applies for, the more opportunities they have to receive
- Any amount helps!

WHERE CAN I FIND SCHOLARSHIPS

 Scholarships are listed in chronological order based on their application due date.

 - Only seniors in central Wisconsin are eligible. This creates a smaller pool of applicants.

EARLY COLLEGE CREDIT PROGRAM (ECCP)

- Allows high school student to take college level course at a public or private university.
- Available for fall and spring courses.
- Partnership with CESA 10 and many local UW's including UWSP, UWEC and UWP.
- You can earn high school and college credit simultaneously.
- Marathon High School pays for courses.
- Some Restrictions Apply!

START COLLEGE NOW (SCN)

- Allows high school student to take college level course at a Wisconsin Technical College.
- Available for fall and spring courses.
- Courses typically taken at NTC.
- You can earn high school and college credit simultaneously.
- Marathon High School pays for courses.
- Some Restrictions Apply!

What courses can I take via ECCP / SCN?

- A course that does not have a comparable offering at MHS.
- You must meet course prerequisites (GPA, courses completed, test scores, admission test, etc).

What do I need to do?

- Apply to ECCP / SCN
 - Paperwork for Fall 2022 courses is due March 1, 2022.
 - Applications MUST be submitted prior to the deadline.
- Apply to the College where you'd like to take the college course.
- Check your Email DAILY!
- Follow instructions given by Ms. Aune

Colleges and Universities set their own guidelines for admission and if tasks are not completed by the deadline, they will drop you from their roster.
