## GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

The Board of Education requires a minimum 22.5 credits to graduate. Required courses to be earned while in grades 9-12 include:

**English:** 4.0 credits

**Mathematics:** 3.0 credits

**Science:** 3.0 credits (including General Science & Biology)

**Social Studies:** 3.0 credits (including one year of U.S. History & one semester of American Government. All seniors are required to pass the State Civics Exam with a score of 60% or higher)

**Personal Finance:** 0.5 credit (to be taken junior or senior year)

**Health\*:** 0.5 credit (not factored in GPA)

**Physical Education\*:** 1.5 credits (not factored in GPA)

## CURRICULUM

A comprehensive curriculum of 100+ courses emphasizes preparation for post-secondary success. Besides offerings in English, mathematics, sciences and social studies, students have an opportunity to take courses in agriscience, business education, physical education, technology, foreign language, and fine arts.

## EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

Besides the formal curriculum, Marathon High students are engaged in many co-curricular activities. Marathon offers a wide array of opportunities including athletics, music, forensics, and clubs ranging from foreign language to math.

## POST SECONDARY ENROLLMENT OPTION

Marathon High School offers a number of opportunities for the high achieving student. Postsecondary Enrollment Options (ECCP & Start College Now) are programs in which 10th-12th grade students may opt to attend a Wisconsin institution of higher education for the purpose of taking one or more courses offered by that institution which would then apply toward credit required for high school graduation.
